INVESTING IN CAYMANIAN STUDENTS

Since the inception of our Scholarship Program in 2008, we have provided monetary assistance to many Caymanian students who wish to further their post high school education locally, allowing them to obtain degrees or vocational training in the field of their choice.

We grant scholarships to students who wish to attend The University College of the Cayman Islands, The International College of the Cayman Islands or locally based vocational training. HOW TO MAKE YOUR APPLICATION FORM DAZZLE

Your application represents you on paper, which means it reflects who you are, so making a favourable first impression on paper is critical.

Remember that competition to win a scholarship is tougher than ever as more students are applying for these prestigious and highly sought-after awards.

There is no room for error.

SO HERE ARE SOME USEFUL TIPS ON HOW TO MAKE YOUR APPLICATION DAZZLE.

Start doing your research early - don't wait until the last minute and rush your application.

Eligibility to apply - are you qualified for the scholarship you are applying for? Take your time to research which scholarships you are eligible to apply for. Don't waste your time or the scholarship committee's time if you don't qualify.

Read instructions carefully - check the requirements which can include writing an essay, completing a form, and

submitting references. Ensure you understand what the business/institution expects from you and follow those instructions precisely.

Take your time - give your application the time, concentration, and dedicated preparation it deserves.

Avoid spelling mistakes - careless spelling errors make you appear sloppy. Pay close attention to detail. Ask a friend, parent, teacher to proofread the final version of your application form.

Answer every question - don't leave any boxes blank. There is a reason you are being asked the question, don't dismiss it.

Relevance - include all relevant information about your experience, your interests, and goals, which are compatible with the scholarship on offer.


Sell yourself - highlight your strengths and accomplishments, most all of be yourself, honest and open.

References - ask people who know you well to write letters of recommendation and ensure that they clearly highlight in what capacity they know you.

If you're unsure about any questions or requirements, ask a teacher or counselor.

Don't forget to make a copy for yourself of your completed application.

Finally, wait patiently to be invited for an interview. Good luck!







And that’s when we can begin exploring and testing a world of ideas, repeatedly, in order to truly create meaningful innovations.”

Among the innovators bringing these projects to life are many of Dart’s Scholars, recipients of either a high school or university scholarship that provides financial support, mentorship and hands on work experience designed to encourage, support and inspire students to achieve their full potential.

Dart’s scholars have played key roles across a number of inventive projects taking ownership of crucial elements during their work experience, including testing technology, proof of concept and presenting product concepts to

ZÜN

ZÜN cars launched in 2020 at Camana Bay, a collaboration between Arch Automotive and Dart. Combining leading in-car and smart phone technology, ZÜN members can borrow from a fleet of cars from their phones with on-demand access and rates suited to running a quick errand to overnight hire. The idea was born to provide a solution to Cayman’s rush hour gridlock and flexibility for drivers who are new on island or who need a second car on a temporary or ongoing basis. Research showed users were happy to change up their commute but wanted access to a vehicle during their working day. Telematics technology facilitates the communication between smart phones and the ZÜN fleet and Dart’s scholars put this technology through its paces in different

scenarios and reported their findings including ZÜN’s app development, customer registration, payment processing, location zoning and car rental check out. Months of rigorous testing produced the seamless and convenient system that powers ZÜN’s operations today.

READY SPACES

Sensing a global shift towards flexible working, the project team at Dart began exploring how this might transpire for their tenants and employees.

Fast forward to today where hot-desking and flexible working have been rolled out across the organisation and Ready Spaces provides local and international business owners vibrant, modern office space on month-to-month terms. The offices include high speed WiFi, a full-time receptionist, shared printing facilities, meeting rooms and kitchen space, delivering both convenience and greater sustainability. Dart Scholars’ work experience included the design and roll out of the hot-desk pilot across the company and testing and selecting the software for the Ready Spaces concept to create the best experience for members and visitors, from booking room space to door access, Wifi and network control as well as back-end services such as billing, newsletters and tenant management.

INNOVATION IN DEVELOPMENT

Thoughtfulness, creativity and innovation are inherent to Dart’s approach to

sustainable building and drive the vision to balance environment, economy and society. Built with connectivity and accessibility in mind, Camana Bay exemplifies Dart’s approach to creating places that enrich lives now and for future generations. Referrals: Listen to current students' experiences and check the college's graduation results. Caymanian students may feel more comfortable attending a college where other Caymanians are studying. Find out about class sizes, professors, activities, etc.

Contemplate these factors and you'll be able to make a sound decision.





Studying abroad can be a life-changing experience that will allow you to explore a new culture, build up resilience and enhance life skills that will benefit you for years to come. So don't rule out applying for international programmes and scholarship opportunities. One key factor to consider when studying abroad is that you will likely need a student visa.

This article will look at the student visa application process for Caymanian students to study in the US, Canada, and the UK.

US STUDENT VISA APPLICATION PROCESS

Your US student visa will be processed by the US Embassy in Kingston, Jamaica. Before beginning the visa application process, ensure that you have already been accepted into an American university or college.

To begin the process, you will need to create a profile at <https://ais.usvisa-info.com/en-jm/niv>, and student visas are under the F category, which covers those who wish to attend:

- University or college.
- High school.
- Private elementary school.
- Seminary.
- Conservatory.
- Another academic institution including language training programmes.

Your student visa will be category M if you are accepted into vocational training or other non-academic training institutions.

You will need to complete the DS-160 form, which can only be completed at <https://ceac.state.gov/CEAC> and once you have completed this form, you will need to print the barcode confirmation sheet.

That barcode sheet will be scanned once you go into the embassy for your interview.

You must complete the DS-160 form before completing the visa application process at <https://ais.usvisa-info.com/en-jm/niv>.

You will also need to pay a student visa fee online and a Student and Exchange Visa Information System (SEVIS) fee at <https://www.fmjfee.com/i901fee/index.html>. Visa application fees are non-refundable and non-transferrable. The non-immigrant visa application fee for student visas is USD \$160*.

Then you will need to schedule your consular section appointment.

For the interview:

- Arrive no sooner than 15 minutes before your appointment time.
- Queue for security screening.
- Have your fingerprints verified.
- Interview with a consular officer.

The interview is usually short, lasting around three minutes. You must convince the consular officer that you are a qualified student (your acceptance into a US university or college should show this), you are able to pay for the planned studies and that you have post-education plans.

Essential documents that you will need to carry are:

- The Form I-20 which shows that you have English proficiency, your school's official signature, SEVIS ID number and your tuition and finances (including any scholarships).
- Any scholarships documentations.
- Proof you have the funds to cover at least one year of the planned study.

If your visa is approved, the consular officer will keep your passport, the visa processing is usually done in two weeks. You will receive an email to notify you when your visa is available for pickup.

US student visas are valid

for five years from the date of issue.

CANADIAN STUDY PERMIT APPLICATION PROCESS

You will need a study permit if you intend to study in Canada for more than six months.

Here are the documents that you will need to apply:

- Proof of acceptance from your school.
- Proof of identity in the form of your Caymanian passport.
- Proof of financial support.

You may also need a letter of explanation outlining why you want to study in Canada and understand your responsibilities as a student in Canada. If you are applying for a study permit in Quebec, you will also need a Certificat d'acceptation du Québec (CAQ), which is issued by the Gouvernement du Québec. Your school can give you all the details on applying for the CAQ.

To apply for the study permit, you must have your letter of acceptance from a designated learning institution with a COVID-19 readiness plan. You can then apply online at <https://www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/services/application/account.html>.

There are detailed instructions on how to apply on the website, please read carefully before applying:

You will also have to pay processing fees and biometrics. Study permit fees are CAN \$150, and the biometric fee is CAN \$85*. There are also third-party fees which can include medical exams and police certificates.

To limit the spread of COVID-19, the Consulate of Canada to the Cayman Islands in Seven Mile Beach is limiting in-person services, so call

or email to find out about the necessary biometric and fingerprinting processes. Email cdncon.cayman@candw.ky or call (345) 949-9400.

You will get your study permit at the port of entry when you arrive in Canada. Before your arrival, the government of Canada will issue you a port of entry letter of introduction that says that you are allowed to study in Canada. You will also be sent an electronic travel authorization (eTA) valid for five years or until your passport expires.

UK STUDENT VISA APPLICATION PROCESS

As a Caymanian student, you will need a Tier 4 (General) visa to study in the UK. The earliest you can apply for your student visa is six months before starting your course of study. It usually takes three weeks for you to get the visa.

If you are 18 or older and studying at the degree level, you can stay in the UK for up to five years on your student visa.

It costs £348* to apply for a student visa. You will also need to pay for a 'healthcare surcharge' as part of your visa application. How much you pay is dependent on how long your visa lasts. You can calculate online to find out how much this charge will be. Factors used in the calculation include your study start date, your age and if you are applying alone or with dependents, etc.

You must have an unconditional offer from a school before applying for your student visa. To prove this, you will be provided with a Confirmation of Acceptance for Study reference number. You will need to

enter this number on the visa application.

You will also need to show that you have enough money to pay for your planned studies and support yourself while living in the UK. You will need to prove that you have enough money for at least one academic year.

The documents that you will need to apply include:

- A valid passport.
- Your Confirmation of Acceptance for Study.
- Proof you have enough money to cover your tuition and fees and the cost of living.
- Proof of parental consent if you are under 18.
- Written consent from your financial sponsor if you have received sponsorship.

Once you have all the necessary documents, you are ready to apply. You will need to prove your identity as part of your application process. You will have to give your fingerprint and photograph at the visa application centre in George Town at: **Genesis Building, 13 Genesis Close, Oceanside Group Suite, 4th floor, Grand Cayman**
There may be an additional charge at the visa centre of £55.*

You must apply online, <https://www.gov.uk/student-visa/apply>. It usually takes three weeks for a decision to be made on your visa application.

The student visa application process can be time-consuming, please take your time and read the instructions carefully. Please apply for your student visa early.

HOW TO IMPRESS AT A SCHOLARSHIP INTERVIEW

Atending any type of interview is one of the most nerve-wracking moments in anyone's life but if you prepare well there's no need to worry.

Follow this advice and you will be equipped to excel and leave the interview knowing you did everything possible to make a good impression and secure the scholarship.

PREPARE THOROUGHLY
It goes without saying that ahead of the scholarship interview you need to prepare as thoroughly as possible.

Read up about the company, imagine the questions you might be faced with and think about questions you'd like to ask.

Five of the most common interview questions include:

Tell us about yourself; Why do you want this scholarship? What would you bring to this company? What are your strengths and weaknesses? What do you plan to be doing in five years?

Ask a friend or family member to pretend to be the interviewer so you can practice your answers and get them clear in your head, which will also help to calm any nerves.

If possible, contact someone who has already undertaken a scholarship and ask them for advice on how they approached the interview and questions on what the scholarship involved and what they are doing now.

GET SOME REST
This might seem obvious but the evening and night before the interview you should make sure you get plenty of rest so

that your body and mind are prepared and you're fully alert the next day.

If nerves keep you awake, try listening to some music or reading a book, until you naturally drift off to sleep.

EAT WELL
Studies have shown a good breakfast is essential to boost energy as well as concentration levels, so make sure you eat well before the interview, whether it's scheduled for the morning or afternoon.

The last thing you want is a growling stomach to distract you and the interviewer/s!

STAY CALM
Try to keep any nervous energy in check by reminding yourself that because you've been called for interview, you must meet the scholarship criteria, and the interview is

just a chance for the company to get to know you better.

Out of hundreds, or maybe even thousands of applicants, they have chosen to interview you, which should be a confidence booster.

DRESS TO IMPRESS
Wear a suit or other appropriate smart clothing to demonstrate your professionalism.

Most recruitment experts suggest arriving about 10-15 minutes before the interview time which will also give you plenty of time to check your appearance in the bathroom.

Make eye contact with everyone you are introduced to, be friendly and smile.

BE ENTHUSIASTIC
The interview itself is your time to shine.

Make sure the interviewer knows that you want the scholarship and are enthusiastic about the area of study. Show how interested you are in the company by sitting up straight, being attentive and speaking clearly.

Remember this is your chance to sell yourself and leave the interviewer/s with no doubt that you are ready for this opportunity and will make the most of it.

Application Period: **15 November 2021 - 31 January 2022**

The overseas scholarship can facilitate Fall 2022 or Spring 2023 start date. Scholarships are available to pursue overseas tertiary studies; TVET, Associate, Bachelor, Masters (campus and online), & Doctoral studies (campus and online).

For both Local and Overseas Scholarships:

Applications can only be submitted during the stated application periods. And can be submitted without final grades or final acceptance letters.
ALL applications must be made using the online portal.

MOST FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do I apply for a local or overseas Government Educational scholarship?

You can apply for a local or overseas scholarship by going to the Scholarship webpage at moescholarships.gov.ky.

The entire application process is online and you will be required to complete an online application together with uploading other supporting documentation. You should use the guidance notes available on the website or contact the Scholarship Secretariat for guidance by email: scholarships@gov.ky.

What are the academic criteria required to qualify for a Government Educational Scholarship?

The academic criteria for the various local and overseas scholarships are provided on the website. The overseas academic criteria are each listed as standalone documents for each scholarship while the local academic criteria are included in the specific application forms. Additional information is also available in the guidance notes in the relevant sections.

Is there a minimum and maximum age requirement for a scholarship?

There is a minimum age requirement where all applicants must be at least 17 years old by September 1st at the start of their studies. There is no maximum age restriction.

I don't have my final results yet. Can I still apply for a scholarship?

Yes, you can and should apply for the scholarship - both local and overseas while you await your final examinations and final results. You can be conditionally approved pending final results. If you have any questions about this please contact the Scholarship Secretariat at email: scholarships@gov.ky.

What are the deadlines for the submission of application forms?

The Overseas scholarship application period is 15th Nov - 31st Jan annually. The Local Scholarship application period is 1st March - 30th April annually.

Am I able to apply for a scholarship to pursue online studies?

Yes, the Government Educational Scholarships are available to pursue online studies at the local undergraduate level at ICCI and the UWI Open Campus. Online study with an overseas institution is only available at the post-graduate degree level (i.e. Masters level or higher). Please note: you do not have to complete a medical if you are doing postgraduate studies online.

Does my acceptance at a local or overseas institution guarantee the award of a scholarship?

No, acceptance into a university locally or overseas does not guarantee the award of a scholarship. It forms part of the requirements but other criteria must also be met including but not limited to academics. If you are in doubt please contact the Scholarship Secretariat at email: scholarships@gov.ky.

What do I have to do to maintain my local or overseas scholarship?

Both local and overseas undergraduate scholarship recipients are required to achieve a semester GPA of 2.75 (US) / 2:2 (UK) or higher during their first year of studies whether locally or overseas and a semester GPA of 3.0 (US) / 2:1 (UK) or higher during subsequent years of study. Post-graduate scholarship recipients are to achieve a semester GPA of 3.0 (US) / 2:1 (UK) throughout their studies. A' Level students are required to achieve grades C, C, C in 3 out of 4 AS subjects taken in the 1st year to continue funding into their 2nd year of studies.

Are scholarship opportunities available to persons who have Special Education Needs and wish to pursue tertiary education?

There are provisions available to accommodate high school graduates with Special Education Needs and applicants are encouraged to communicate with the Secretariat about these opportunities (email: scholarships@gov.ky).

Are there special considerations for student athletes who represent the Cayman Islands?

Yes, students who continue their athletic training while on scholarship can qualify for adjusted academic requirements as long as they provide ongoing proof of their athlete status. For further details email: scholarships@gov.ky.

Is career and tertiary education guidance available to me if I am

unsure of the post-secondary opportunities available to me?

Yes, the Scholarship Secretariat does offer career and tertiary education guidance to anyone needing assistance. Continued support is offered to scholarship awardees during their post-secondary and tertiary experience. To set up an appointment, send an email with particulars to scholarships@gov.ky.

Are local and overseas scholarship opportunities available to mature candidates?

Yes, both local and overseas scholarship opportunities are available to mature persons who are encourage to contact the Scholarship Secretariat by email: scholarships@gov.ky.

Can I be approved to pursue a foundation year at the beginning of my course of study?

The Government Educational Scholarship does not fund the foundation year as this year does not contribute to the degree. It is a pre-qualification year that, on completion, allows the student to gain acceptance to Year 1 of the degree programme. If you have further questions on this, email: scholarships@gov.ky.

How much is the overseas scholarship award?

Overseas undergraduate studies are funded up to \$30,000 KYD per annum for up to four years. Overseas postgraduate studies are funded up to \$35,000 KYD per annum for up to two years for masters studies, and up to three years for doctoral studies. Funds are disbursed to the student in two equal payments - Fall (August/September) and Spring (December/January) for on campus studies. Different protocols apply for online studies. For specific situations, email: scholarships@gov.ky.

How much is the local scholarship award?

Local scholarship amount varies per scholarship, per level, and per institution. You can email scholarships@gov.ky to receive information specific to the area of interest. However,

the funds are paid to the institutions directly and not to the individual students.

Can I receive a scholarship for another degree at the same level?

No, scholarships are not approved for persons at the same level of study that they have already attained, whether or not the qualifications were funded by the Cayman Islands Government.

Can I defer my studies?

Yes, you can defer your studies for up to one year from the scholarship award. If you are already enrolled in the course of study, you must provide approval from the institution and as well as an explanation with supporting documentation for your decision to defer.

Who approves the application for the Government Educational Scholarship?

The Education Council who is appointed by the Minister of Education, reviews, approves or declines all applications against the criteria outlined in the Education Council Policy & Procedures Guide.

Am I expected to return to the Cayman Islands when I have completed my studies?

Yes, your scholarship award includes an agreement that you are bonded to return to the Cayman Islands for the length of time of the scholarship award. Failure to do so can result in the request for repayment of the full sums awarded. You can request to defer your bond for up to three years from completion - this will need to be approved by Education Council.

What can I do as an applicant to help the process run as smoothly and quickly as possible?

You can ensure that you complete the application as directed and that you provide all required documents including updated information in a timely fashion during all aspects of the scholarship from applying for to maintaining your scholarship.
